USAJOBS/CareerConnector Quick Tips

#1 – Ensure Timely Submission of Completed Applications by applying Early. All applications must be completed prior to 11:59 Eastern Time on the closing date of the announcement.

Visit <u>USAJOBS/CareerConnector – Applying for IRS Jobs Online</u> for additional information.

Employees may contact the "IRS Jobs Online Help Desk" that has been created to provide assistance to employees when they are applying for vacancies on USAJOBS/CareerConnector. Employees may call 1-866-743-5748, select Option 1 for the ERC and follow the prompts for the "IRS Jobs Online Help Desk".

- #2 **Be sure to** answer **Yes** to the **Applicant Eligibility** question, when searching for IRS internal announcements. This will signify that you are a current IRS Federal employee.
- #3 For assistance in creating your online resume in USAJOBS:
 - Create a My USAJOBS account at https://My.USAJOBS.gov create and store up to 5 different resumes.
 - Resume Tools are Available to Assist You in Creating Your Resume, visit the ERC - Applying for an IRS Job Online.
- #4 **USAJOBS Search Agent:** Would you like to receive an email notifying you of a new announcement? Then Create a USAJOBS Search Agent.

What is a USAJOBS Search Agent? Search agents automatically retrieve jobs matching specified criteria and email the results to you. You will receive notifications of any new announcements posted that meet your selected criteria. If you have a "My USAJOBS" account, you can create up to five Job Search Agents. Scroll to the bottom of this link: "My Job Search Agents", and located the "My Job Search Agents" tutorial, which provide you a step by step process on how to set up your USAJOBS Search Agent.

#5 - Internal Announcement or External Announcement

Do You Know the Difference?

When searching on USAJOBS, IRS employees will be able to see both Internal and External positions. It is important to apply to the internal positions since IRS employees are given first consideration. Here's a tip: When searching for positions on USAJOBS, IRS employees should be sure to check "Yes" to the Applicant Eligibility Question.
